



Group Organisation and Conduct Policy

When a young person join's Scouting they become a member of a Local Scout Group.

Your child is a member of... **1st Tidworth Scout Group**

To ensure that your child makes the most of his/her Scouting Experience the adult leaders in the Group will:

- Provide regular fun, learning activities & new skills for life, in a controlled safe environment.
- Offer your child the opportunity to achieve success through staged badges and a balanced programme.
- Offer opportunities for outdoor and nights away experiences.

To achieve these opportunities the adult leaders, require support and co-operation from the parents and family of the young people.

What we expect from Parents and Carers

- Young people in the Beaver and Cub Sections to be delivered into the Headquarters by a responsible adult and leaders informed of who is collecting the child at the end of the evening.
- Ensure that the child is collected from the meeting on time.
- Leaders to be informed if the young person is unable to attend a meeting
- Leaders to be informed of any specific need that a young person may have, temporarily or long term
- When parents or carers are at a Scout event, whether the end of an evening meeting or a more social occasion, unless otherwise specified, the young person is required to follow the instructions of the Group Leaders until dismissed back to the parents.
- Parents should always respect the leadership and ensure that their own conduct sets a good example.
